Final In-Person 20 minute program

The program should feature a diverse selection of compositions encompassing various styles and historical periods, with at least one piece composed after the year 2000. The repertoire can comprise individual movements from larger works, such as sonatas, concerti, and solo compositions. While there is no obligation to perform every movement from a single work, if a movement is chosen, it must be played in its entirety. Modifying accompaniments and omitting repeats is permissible.
